Page 13, right column, second paragraph	The percentage is 43% not 42%. The sentence must read: "The most threatened taxonomic groups in South Africa are cartilaginous fishes (sharks, rays and chimaeras), as 43% are threatened."
Page 42, right column, third line	The word 'endemic' is missing. The sentence must read: "Up to 66% of endemic fresh-water fish taxa are threatened, due to invasive alien fish and habitat modification."
